Welcome to our first quarter news update! It's been a great start to 2017 and we'd like to take you through a quick tour of each of our projects thus far.

Community Sports Center Opened

In January we completed the construction of a "Futsal" soccer pitch in Snoul district of Kratie province, & opened the first ever Community Sports Center in the area. A volley ball court has also been built and a Boules court is underway. Managed by our co-worker, Mr. Suon Borith, the Center also has an outdoor café and coffee shop, as well as

Education & Training Programs

Educating children and equipping parents & teachers with needed resources continues to be one of our main focus areas in 2017.

Alex traveled to Siem Reap each month for meetings with our local teaching staff to discuss progress, challenges and solutions. Ann began weekly short trainings for the teaching staff at the Village Learning Center in Kampong Speu, as well as for the Khmer teacher's at DK International School in Phnom Penh. These trainings provide needed input and current educational research to strengthen the



hard working teachers in their important tasks. "Teaching others to teach others to teach others!" 2 Timothy 2:2

We began our 11th year of free education programs for primary school students in Siem Reap. During the weekdays, 400 children in 3rd to 6th grade are enrolled in English and computer classes in 2 different public schools. In the evenings, the classrooms are open for high school students—most of them graduates of our primary school program—who wish to continue their English and IT training.

At the Kampong Speu Village Learning Center, over 120 children are enrolled in English & IT classes. With a special emphasis on Early Childhood Education, we now have 30 little ones enrolled in preschool. Starting early with language skills & learning fun is a great preparation for their formal education.



Public Service Radio

Ann was invited by the Far East Broadcast Co., a Christian radio station, to be a guest speaker on their Child Safety & Parenting program. The topic was "The Effects of Screen Time; TV, Ipad & Smart Phones, on Child Development." We discussed other activities besides the screen, that are more important to a child's creativity & development.

We had nothing. But you always visit us. You taught us about God. You pray for us. You bring us together for joyful celebrations. You give us food and other needed supplies. We shared testimonies, laughed, danced & played fun games with prizes; it was lovely!
