## Rural Education Expansion

The final months of 2017 saw great progress for our rural education programs, thanks to our amazing & hardworking staff and the generosity of friends and sponsors. Here are some of the highlights:

We were able to purchase a van for the Learning Center in Kampong Speu, enabling us to reach out to distant villages and provide transport for children who live to far to walk or ride their bicycles. Many families were eager



for their children to have a chance to attend both our preschool and English classes. Our student enrollment swelled to over 200 in a few short weeks. As result we brought in 3 more staff to help with teaching, driving and classroom assistants. The licensing & registration for the school was granted, a signboard erected and school uniforms made.

Thanks to a grant from Mira Scholars, we opened a special advanced English class for 10th grade students, to prepare them for college or work after their High School graduation. Scholarships were granted to 30 of the top students from the local high school.

SV Charity sponsored new desks for the 2nd floor classrooms, an awning for the stairs and a covered parking area. This has greatly improved the safety factor as now all motorcycles and bicycles are kept separate from the children's play patio.

The goal of our rural education projects is to provide quality education to children from low income families in remote, rural districts, where the need is great and the opportunities are few. Many rural households rely on subsistence farming or factory work to support their families with an average monthly income of under \$300, and in some cases considerably less than that.

Would you consider sponsoring a student for either preschool, English lessons or Computer training? We will be opening another Community Learning Center next month in Siem Reap, following our model in Kampong Speu. In both locations, you could sponsor a student for \$50 per quarter (@ \$17 per month), or \$200 for the year. There are many children waiting to enroll. On December 31st we had a Christmas/New Year party in Kampong Speu for the entire school. 150 of the younger children came in the morning and had lunch, then 50 of the teen students plus other villagers came for dinner. All together we fed about 400 people that day! Groups of students did dance performances and a Nativity Play. For many of the newly enrolled students, this was their very first Christmas celebration and their first time to hear the story of the birth of Jesus. The children helped to make most of the decorations and tree ornaments during art classes. We had games and prizes for tug-of—war, musical chairs, and bobbing for pears! Each children received a special gift with their own storybook, activity book, school supplies, donated clothes and toys, and some sweets. It was a joyous occasion!

Close to midnight, once all of the guests had left, we gathered together with our coworkers under a bright starry sky to celebrate our victories of the past year our and share our hopes and prayers for 2018. It was a perfect ending to a wonderful year!
