## Village Learning Center Expansion

This quarter, 4 new rooms were added to the village Learning Center in Kampong Speu. These rooms will accommodate teachers, interns & volunteers, who play an integral part in the program. AMC Co., from Singapore, sponsored the buildings in honor of a colleague, the late Herry Sahak. A crew of 16 came to help mix cement, lay the foundation, and build pillars, all by hand! They also provided 2 month's of food supplies for 60 of the poorest elderly from the nearby community.

A team of 16 Australian High School students, from World Challenge (the first volunteers to use one of the new cottages) finished off the flooring and helped lay the outer sidewalks. A grant from Mira Scholars put the final touches on with lovely plaster ceilings. It was teamwork at its best! Thanks to all who helped make it happen.

We were blessed with the help of volunteer teachers, Ryan and Lena, who came up from NZ to assist the preschool & primary classes, teach daily academics to the resident kids, and introduce music lessons on the recorder! NUS interns, Jessica and Amelia, spent one



month of their semester break with us and were a great help with English language instruction.

And last, but not least, we equipped our IT Lab with 8 desks, 8 computers and a large screen TV to begin daily computer classes for the village children. The students begin with learning the keyboard and how to touch type, first in Khmer and then in English. Microsoft Word and Excel programs will follow!





### **Special Olympic Games**

We were honored to help the National Special Olympics Committee of Cambodia host the 2016 games. 200 youth from Cambodia, Vietnam, Laos, Thailand and Myanmar had 2 days of soccer competitions. We were responsible for lunch and drinking water for all of the athletes and their coaches.
